[Continuation of last week's sermon summary]

\Manna had to be gathered daily. Faith lasts only for that day. I believe God's life, the heavenly element. cannot remain long within our perishable earthly bodies. The Bible states, "My Spirit will not contend with humans forever, for they are mortal" (Genesis 6:3), and St. Paul wrote, "What is perishable cannot inherit what is imperishable" (1 Corinthians 15:50). Therefore, the early church celebrated the Eucharist daily. "They devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple every day, breaking bread in their homes..." (Acts 2:46). I believe the Eucharistic bread itself was meant to last only that day. The effect of the Eucharistic bread received during worship is entirely different from that received at home afterward. The Eucharist received during worship truly gives strength. However, because they put the manna in a jar, placed it before the Lord, and stored it for generations (16:33), this gave rise to the concept of the reserved Eucharist. In both the Catholic and Orthodox Churches, the consecrated bread is kept in the tabernacle. The power of faith quickly fades. It lasts only a few hours. If you go two or three days without reading the Bible or praying, you become complacent, and your faith disappears. Faith comes from God, so we must seek it daily and continue receiving it daily. Faith exists only when we worship and pray toward God—that is, only when we are connected to God. By reading the Bible daily, offering prayers, and continually partaking of the Eucharist, this repetition allows heavenly things, God's life, to enter the human body more quickly. In an instant, the Holy Spirit fills us, and heaven is created within our hearts.
